from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm in the Social Hall.

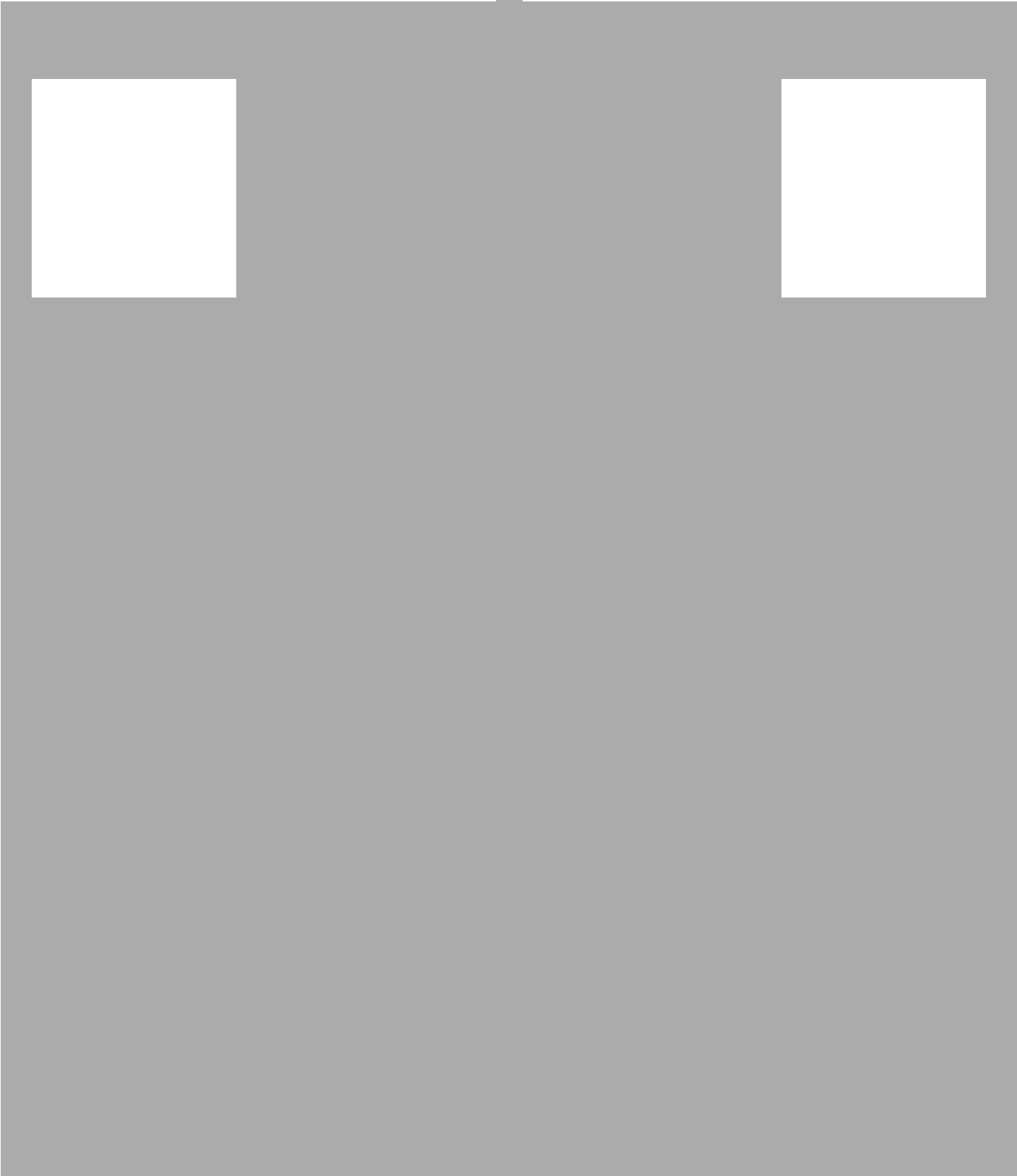
It's more than a little spooky to imagine how our lives

Cross International is a new and energetic organization that works with the "poorest of the poor" in Third World nations throughout the world. Long-term projects are introduced into these countries to make them more self-sufficient. There will be no second collection taken up at the Masses that weekend. Thank You, Blood Donors: This weekend is blood-drive weekend. Thank you to all of our parishioners who generously are truly giving a "gift of life" today by donating blood. Special thanks to Mary Johnston for her hard work in organizing this year's blood drive.

Attention Seniors: There will be no senior Mass and luncheon on the First Friday of November—November 2. That day is the Feast of All Souls. On Friday evening there will be a special Mass and reception remembering family members and friends who died during the past year. A reception with light refreshments will follow the Mass. **The December First Friday Mass and luncheon scheduled for December 7 will be moved to Friday, December 14.** On Friday evening, December 7, there will be a special vigil Mass at 7:00 pm celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. This feast is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Council of Catholic Women will be hosting a dessert reception after Mass to celebrate the Feast of St. Ambrose, our patron, whose feast day is also December 7th. Since many senior parishioners will want to attend this evening Mass, we will move the December Senior Mass and luncheon (Christmas Party) to Friday, December 14th. We will also celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at that Mass. **Seniors over 65--please mark your calendars and plan to attend the Mass on December 14th at 11:00 am followed by lunch at 11:45 am.**

All Saints Day: Thursday, November 1, is the Feast of All Saints. This year it is observed as a Holy Day of Obligation. Catholics are expected to attend Mass on that day. Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 am, 8:45 am (school Mass), and 7:00 pm (There will be no special collection taken up at the Masses on that day.)

All Souls Day Mass: There will be a special All Souls Day Mass on Friday evening, November 2, at 7:00 pm to remember those who died during the past year. There will be a reception with light refreshments following the Mass.

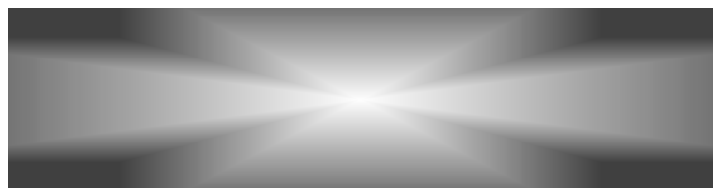

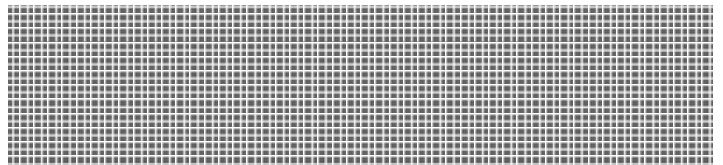
