Ash Wednesday Masses: The season of Lent begins this Wednesday, February 25, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Masses will be celebrated at 7:00 a.m., 8:45 a.m. (School Mass) and 7:00 p.m. Ashes will be distributed after the Homily. Please plan to join us for Mass on Ash Wednesday to mark the beginning of this special penitential season.

Special Collection on Ash Wednesday: A special collection will be taken up at all the Masses on Ash Wednesday in support of the Church in Eastern Europe. Envelopes for this collection are available at the entrances to the Church. If you are not going to be at Mass on Ash Wednesday, you could make a donation to this collection by using the special envelope and putting it in the collection basket on Sunday.

Ash Wednesday Fast and Abstinence: This Wednesday (*and Good Friday*) are days of fast and abstinence. Catholics are asked to abstain from eating meat on Wednesday and to fast from eating between meals and limiting the meal size. (*Please read the Lenten Regulations posted in this bulletin regarding specifics about fast and abstinence and other Lenten/Easter requirements.*)

Stations of the Cross: Every Friday at 6:00 p.m. during Lent we will offer the communal celebration of the Stations of the Cross. The Stations are a wonderful way for Catholics to enter the Pascal mystery of Christ's suffering and death on the Cross. This Friday we will have our annual Parish Fish Fry after Stations. On the other Fridays during Lent we will have a simple meatless soup supper and a roll. Please join us on the Fridays of Lent for this important devotion.

Friday Abstinence: Reminder—all Fridays during Lent are to be observed as day of abstinence from meat (chicken, pork, beef, lamb) in order to enter into the penitential spirit of the season.

Lenten Confessions: Lent is a penitential season of preparation for Easter. Catholics should make an effort to go to confession during the season (*especially if they are in a state of grave or mortal sin*). Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoons from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. Beginning on March 7 and throughout Lent both Fr. Bill and Fr. Gally will be hearing confessions. You can also schedule an appointment for confession with Fr. Bill or Fr. Gally through the office during regular office hours. Many local parishes are also having communal celebrations on weeknights or Sunday afternoons if this is more convenient. Contact the neighboring parishes to find out if and when they are having a communal celebration.

Religious Education Drop-Off: If you want to avoid the traffic jam in the parking lot on Sunday morning, you may drop your children off on Nevada Avenue/east door that is closest to the office. These doors are open on Sunday mornings and parents can even park on Nevada Avenue and pick children up in the classrooms rather than fighting the traffic jam in the parking lot.

Sending Rite: This Sunday at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, the Rite of Sending will send the members of our RCIA program forth to the celebration of the Rite of Election at the Cathedral where they will be formally presented to the Bishop on Saturday, February 28. Please keep them in your prayers.

Parish Fish Fry: This Friday we will have our annual Parish Fish Fry after Stations of the Cross. Everyone is invited. Dinner will begin at 6:30 p.m. Volunteers are needed to help cook, set-up or clean-up. See Bruce Baron at the entrance of the Church if you would like to sign-up to help. The cost is **\$5.00 per person**. *This will be the only Fish Fry we will be having this Lenten season.*

Lenten Vespers: The Liturgy of the Hours—evening prayer—will be chanted by the choir and prayed by the community on the Sundays during Lent. We will gather at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoons for exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and prayer. Please make this a part of your Lenten devotions.

Eucharistic Holy Hour and Rosary: Remember—Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary and Benediction are celebrated every Wednesday in the devotional chapel at 1:00 p.m. Everyone is invited.

Official 2009 Lenten and Easter Observance

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 25, 2009. It is a time of baptismal renewal and preparation for the Easter celebration of the Lord’s death and resurrection. Personal, family and small group prayer, daily mass, fasting, acts of mortification and works of charity and service are highly recommended ways of observing the Lenten season. So, too, is greater reflection on the Word of God.

Fast and Abstinence

1. All Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from all meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent, unless a particular Friday is a solemnity.
2. All Catholics who are between the ages of 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (Canon #1252)
3. Fasting permits one full meal and two lesser meals, which combined are not greater than the full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.
4. A spirit of fasting is recommended during all of Lent in anticipation of the great feast of Easter. In this way, Christians express their hunger for God, their responsibility to the poor and their recognition of the Kingdom of God as the answer to all human hungers.
5. “Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance.”(Canon #1252)

Privileges-People on the Move

Airport workers, travelers and others while onboard ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fasting and abstinence for the duration of their journey (except Good Friday). However, it is desirable that those so dispensed should perform some pious work in compensation.

Easter Duty

Every Catholic is to receive Holy Communion at least once between the first Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2009, and Trinity Sunday, June 7, 2009, unless a just cause would warrant some other time of year. (Canon # 920)

Marriages

Those marrying during Lent are to abstain from “excessive festivity” and are to take into account the special character of the liturgical season.
